A Short Profile of the College and the Department of B.Ed.

Acharya Jagadish Chandra Bose College, founded on 10thAugust, 1968, had its root in the form of the twin colleges—Birla College of Science & Birla College of Education, actually as Birla School of Education (Teacher's Training College) set up together under the management of Birla Group in the name of Vidyamandir Society, simultaneously affiliated to the University of Calcutta in1969 with effect from the session 1968-1969. The two Institutions were amalgamated into one college under the name of Birla College of Science and Education in the same year. It was renamed as Acharya Jagadish Chandra Bose College with effect from 1stJuly, 1987. The college was affiliated by the U.G.C. under Act 2f and 12(B) in the year 1968 and also recognized by National Council for Teacher Education [N.C.T.E.] for its B.Ed. course since 1995. In the year 2009, the College has been accredited by National Assessment & Accreditation Council (NAAC).

The Dept. of B.Ed. of the college is one of the eldest and prestigious departments of Teacher Education in the state. Throughout the state of West Bengal, other states of India as well as several countries all over the world its alumni have been gracing as teachers or administrators. At present the department itself has three such alumni as teachers, besides others belonging to other departments of the college.

About the Seminar

Achievement of everything depends upon proper policy framework and its implementation at the right earnest. Achievement of right type of education also cannot ignore this perspective. After the introduction of the concept of universalization of education during the British period education policies have been framed and reframed as per the need of the concerned times. National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 is such a policy basically having its precedence in the first National Policy on Education (NPE) of India 1968, the second NPE 1986, Programme of Action (PoA) 1992. The transition from NPE to NEP has to be studied objectively to see if the rechristening is a mere ploy to enjoy political hegemony or NEP 2020 is something extraordinary ensuring its drastic impact upon the education of India that is required to keep pace with the educational pace of the world at large in relation to the changes taking place in the society, economy, polity and technology in consonance with the aspiration of the emerging India. The suggestions and recommendations of NEP 2020 are intended to realise massive reshuffling of Indian education system at all levels. But everything depends upon how school education delivers itself. And, due to a significant correlation between school education and teacher education indirectly teacher education ultimately becomes the deciding factor in ensuring the implementation of whatever is suggested in NEP 2020. If Human Resource Development (HRD) index is deemed to be the main indicator of the developmental index of a nation then teachers form the base of HRD. Then axiomatically enough teacher education forms the pivot of every educational system. Hence, the analysis of NEP should start with its prospective impact upon teacher education and the role of teacher education in enabling us realizing the prospects and aspiration as reflected in NEP 2020. The seminar is intended to elaborate upon different dimensions of NEP 2020 concerning teacher education with the ultimate objective of ensuring the prevalence of constitutional provisions of JUSTICE, LIBERTY, EQUALITY, FRATERNITY in relation to the prevailing global concept of sustainable development. Hence, though, the title of the seminar seems to exclusively relate to Teacher Education in the context of NEP 2020 and WBSEP 2023 it is going to be basically multidisciplinary or inclusive in nature as to be verified with the proposed sub-themes below with a view to ensuring participation from varying disciplines and domains.

Paper Submission Guidelines for Publication

Your valued paper will be published with ISBN. To be eligible for publication the manuscript should be prepared maintaining the following suggested format:

- Title of the paper, Name, Designation, Affiliation/College/Uni./Industry, Contact Number and Email address.
- Name of the author should be in font size of 12 and affiliation in font size 11.
- Title of the paper should be in font size of 14 and should be centrally aligned.
- Abstract of approximately 250-300 words with 3-5 keywords at the end of the abstract. The word limit for final paper is 3000 including abstract. The abstract has to be attached with the Registration Form on or before 10th November, 2023, 04:00 P.M. The full paper is to be sent on or before 06th December, 2023, 04:00 P.M. through the Email ID <u>nat.seminar2023@gmail.com</u>.
- The paper will be reviewed critically by the editorial board and the authors will be intimated through email regarding eligibility of the publication of their articles in the book with ISBN.
- Papers can be submitted in English, Bengali and Hindi-the only languages being dealt with in the department.
- Font for **English:** font size 12, Font-Times New Roman, for **Bengali and Hindi** Font-Kalpurush, Unicode (Avro) and Krutidev 10 respectively.
- Line spacing should be 1.5.
- Paper should be submitted in MS-Word Format.
- All the tables and diagrams should be appropriate in number and to be provided at the end of the paper.
- All reference should follow latest APA style.
- * Submission of declaration form is compulsory for publication. (Download, print, fill in, sign, scan and send).
